Scholarships

Oregon residents and residents of WUE states who apply by February 1 are **automatically considered** for merit-based scholarships upon admissions to SOU. Residents of WUE states automatically receive the Western Undergraduate Exchange tuition rate upon admission—no separate application needed!

Need-based and departmental scholarships are also available. Additional opportunities can be found through the Southern Oregon Scholarship Application (SOSA) at *sou.edu/sosa*.

Application Fee Waiver

The application fee covers the cost of processing an application. However, we do not want the fee to be the reason a student decides not to apply. Therefore, we offer a full application fee waiver on a case-by-case basis. If you have a student who needs an application fee waiver, please contact your admissions counselor. There is no limit to the number we'll waive; we simply ask that you reserve this option for students in sincere need of financial assistance.

Application Review

To get to know our applicants better, we review each application holistically. Applicants are encouraged to supply short answers and a short essay within the admissions application. These sections are not required, but provide context to GPA scores and transcripts. **SOU is now test optional!** Students who take the SAT or ACT can still report their scores to SOU, but this is no longer required for admission.

Admissions counselors review applications from their territories and are a resource for you and your students.

Theatre Arts, Music, and Honors College applicants are required to submit a separate application to the chosen program.

Enrollment Deposit

The \$300 enrollment deposit remains a pivotal "next step" following a student's admission to SOU. Every matriculating student will ultimately pay the \$300 deposit (matriculation fee), however, we are happy to help students defer a large portion of the deposit until financial aid is available.

The priority date for the deposit is May 1. Students are encouraged to submit the deposit as soon as they know SOU is their final choice.

New and Notable Programs

Once a minor only, our **newest major** for 2020-2021 is **Gender, Sexuality, and Women's Studies.**

We've added two **new minors** for this year: **Esports** and **Health Promotions**. Both minors offer a pathway to careers in these growing industries.

We continue to grow our **certificate options**, with three new programs in **Music Industry**, **Sound Design**, and **Transgender Studies** – which is the first of its kind in the U.S.

The **Bridge Program** is designed to invest in the strengths of Oregon college students, especially underrepresented populations: first-generation college students, second language learners, students from low-income families, and under-served minority groups.

Through the Jackson/Josephine County Pledge program, new freshmen from Jackson and Josephine counties may be able to graduate in three years at a reduced tuition rate, saving up to \$3,100 per academic year compared to standard resident tuition!

The **Honors College** offers high achieving freshmen the opportunity to collaborate with faculty and community mentors on research projects and practical experiences. In addition to Honors general education courses, seminars, and a capstone, Honors College students receive a substantial scholarship package.

Our **North State Promise** agreement grants Oregon resident tuition rates to incoming students from California who graduated from a Shasta, Siskiyou, Tehama, Trinity, or Modoc county high school in 2013 or later.

The 2019-2020 season for many sports was interrupted, but SOU had six NAIA Championship qualifying teams:
