Our day includes lots of time for movement and play activities that help develop social-emotional skills and a love of learning, including:

* 90 minutes each day of core reading.

- * 90 minutes each day of core math.
- * Time each day for writing, art, and science activities.
- * Three recesses—and plenty of extra time for movement.
- * Classroom environment that understands the needs of your kindergartener-- includes plenty of bathroom breaks and snack.
 * PE everyday with a CATCH activity once a month that promotes health and wellness.

Breakfast is available at 7:30. School begins at 7:55 and ends at 2:25.



Know their name and recognize their name in print

- Begin to write their name using a capital and lower case letters
- Have print and book awareness
- Have exposure to letter
 names and sounds
- Can talk about stories
- Have experience with pencils, markers, crayons, scissors, and glue
- Identify basic shapes and colors
- Exposure to songs
- Know how to sit crisscross
- Can count to at least 10

- It doesn't have to be all • at once—frequency and consistency are important


Research on Reading

Why Can't I Skip My 20 Minutes of Reading Tonight?

Student "A" Student "B" reads 20 minutes reads 5 minutes each day each day 3600 minutes in 900 minutes in a school year a school year 1,800,000 words 282,000 words

Student "C" reads 1 minute each day

180 minutes in a school year



By the end of 6th grade Student "A" will have read the equivalent of 60 whole school days. Student "B" will have read only 12 school days. Which student would you expect to have a better vocabulary? Which student would you expect to be more successful in school...and in life? (Nagy & Herman, 1987)

Encourage kindergarten readiness by:

- Read together every day, and look at pictures too! Talk about what you read
- Build background knowledge by reading a wide variety of print
- Library summer program
- Incorporate writing in everyday activities, such as grocery lists and games
- Have your child help you in sorting laundry, counting out snacks, or cooking dinner
