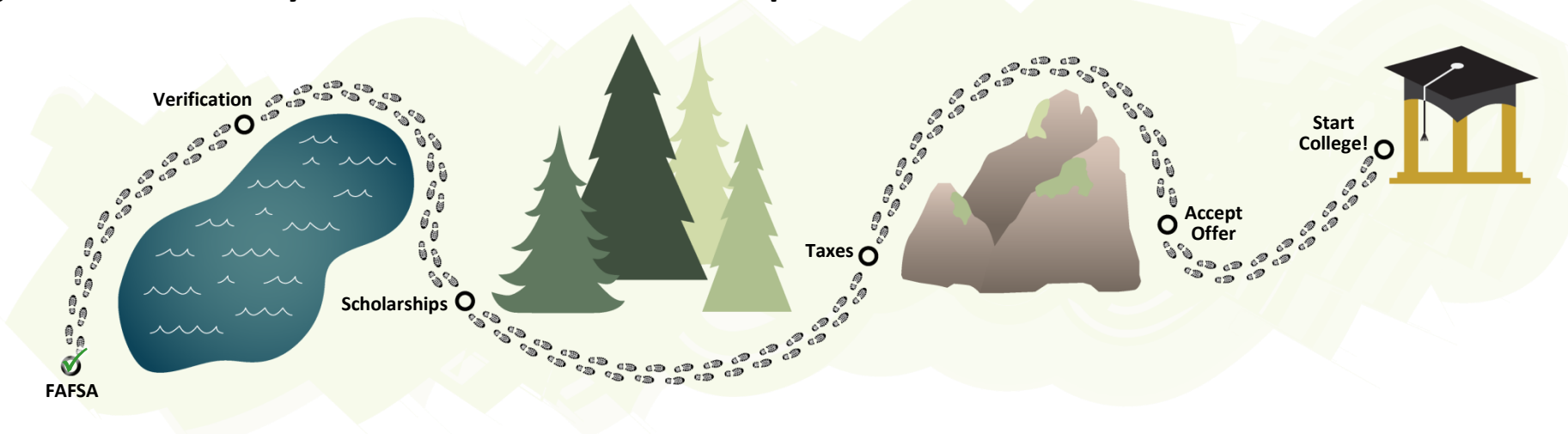


# I just submitted my FAFSA. What's the next step?

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li><input type="checkbox"/> <b>Submit your FAFSA Application!</b></li><li><input type="checkbox"/> Receive your Student Aid Report from the US Dept. of Education. (Check your status at <i>fafsa.gov</i>.)</li><li><input type="checkbox"/> Review it for mistakes!</li><li><input type="checkbox"/> Provide extra documents in a timely manner for verification, if asked. Tax transcripts can be found at <i>irs.gov/individuals/get-transcript</i>.</li><li><input type="checkbox"/> Complete any school-specific financial aid forms, if necessary.</li></ul> <div><b>TIP:</b> Complete your FAFSA as early as possible. Some types of aid have deadlines and distribute money on a first-come, first-serve basis. But it's never too late!</div>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li><input type="checkbox"/> Applying to Oregon schools? Fill out the OSAC Scholarship Application (<i>oregonstudentaid.gov</i>) by Feb 15.</li><li><input type="checkbox"/> Search and apply for other scholarships.</li><li><input type="checkbox"/> If you live with a parent or guardian, talk with them about filing their taxes early.</li></ul> <div><b>TIP:</b> If you plan to attend PCC or MHCC, consider applying to Future Connect. Visit <i>pcc.edu/futureconnect</i> or <i>mhcc.edu/futureconnect</i> for more info.</div>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li><input type="checkbox"/> When your taxes are complete, update <i>fafsa.gov</i> with any new tax information.</li><li><input type="checkbox"/> Check with schools to ensure your financial aid materials are complete.</li><li><input type="checkbox"/> Receive award letter(s).</li><li><input type="checkbox"/> If you have multiple award letters, compare the financial aid packages. You might want to discuss this decision with someone you trust.</li></ul> <div><b>TIP:</b> The recommended order to accept aid is free money (grants and scholarships), earned money (work study), and then borrowed money (loans).</div>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li><input type="checkbox"/> The deadline to accept or decline financial aid is generally May 1.</li><li><input type="checkbox"/> Find out if you will be required to pay a tuition deposit and request a tuition deposit deferment if needed.</li><li><input type="checkbox"/> Once you've accepted an offer, ask about next steps for orientation, class registration, meeting with an advisor and staying on track. There are people and resources available to help you—seek them out.</li><li><input type="checkbox"/> <b>Start College!</b></li></ul> <div><b>TIP:</b> If you have any questions, contact the Financial Aid office at your future school.</div>



**Remember:** These are just the steps you need to follow to ensure you get all the financial aid you are eligible for! To successfully enroll in college, there are other steps – like graduating from high school, taking placement tests and registering for classes – that you will need to complete.
