## Oregon Constitution Reading Guide

The Oregon Constitution, as first written, has been amended many times by the voters. But much of the Constitution still holds, and it is interesting to see what has changed! As you read through the original constitution, follow along on this reading guide and identify the clause that addresses the described issue, or fill in the blanks with the correct answer.

## Bill of Rights

$\qquad$ The State cannot pay taxpayer money to private catholic schools.
$\qquad$ People have freedom of speech, with some reasonable restrictions.
$\qquad$ People who are arrested or placed in jail cannot be tortured.
$\qquad$ A law stating that rich people can speed would be unconstitutional.
$\qquad$ You can't be prosecuted for an act that was outlawed after you did it.
$\qquad$ The State cannot outlaw the ownership of a personal gun.
$\qquad$ The Legislature can outlaw immigration by non-US citizens to Oregon.

## Elections

$\qquad$ Only white males over 21 could vote
$\qquad$ Chinese people could not vote.
$\qquad$ A person could not serve in more than one paid government position at a time.
$\qquad$ The person with the most votes wins, so if nobody runs and the person with the most votes gets write-in votes, that person wins.

## Distribution of Powers

The three branches of State government are:

## Legislative Department

$\qquad$ The State Senate only has up to 30 Senators.
$\qquad$ A person who moved to Lane County 6 months ago cannot serve as a Senator or Representative in the Oregon Legislature.
$\qquad$ Legislative sessions are held every two years.
$\qquad$ Two-thirds of the members of a chamber have to be present to do business.
$\qquad$ The proceedings of the legislature are public.
$\qquad$ All tax bills must start in the House of Representatives.
$\qquad$ The Legislature cannot make laws for a specific city or county.

## Executive Department

$\qquad$ The Governor served for four years, with an 8-year term limit.
$\qquad$ The Secretary of State succeeds the Governor, if they leave office early.
$\qquad$ The Governor controls the Oregon National Guard.
$\qquad$ The Governor can call a special session of the legislature.
$\qquad$ A Governor veto can be over-ridden by a $2 / 3$ vote of both chambers.
$\qquad$ If a vacancy in an office occurs when the Legislature is not in session, the Governor can appoint a temporary replacement.

## Administrative Department

$\qquad$ The Secretary of State audits all the governmental departments, to ensure they are acting accountably.
$\qquad$ Every county had to have an elected county clerk, Treasurer, Sheriff, Coroner, and Surveyor.

## Judicial Department

What are the three major state-level courts that the constitution created?

$\qquad$ Judges of the Oregon Supreme Court are elected.
$\qquad$ The number of supreme court justices could not be more than 7 (no longer limited, but we have 7 currently).
$\qquad$ The Supreme Court can only reconsider Circuit Court decisions.
$\qquad$ A decision at a County Court may be appealed to a Circuit Court.
$\qquad$ Most public officers cannot be impeached.
$\qquad$ Supreme Court judges can be impeached by a $2 / 3$ vote of each chamber.

## Education and School Lands

$\qquad$ By default, the Governor is the Superintendent of Public Instruction.
$\qquad$ The Common School fund is supported by revenues from public lands.

## Finance

$\qquad$ If expenses in one year exceed income, the legislature must pay it off the following year.

## Militia

$\qquad$ The Militia could call up most males from 18 to 45 years of age.

## Corporations and Internal Improvements

$\qquad$ The state cannot print money.
$\qquad$ The legislature can prescribe how towns can tax their citizens.
$\qquad$ The State cannot buy stock in a company.

$\qquad$ Newly arriving ethnic Chinese could not own property.
