



FRMS continues to work towards its goal of improving student achievement by building a school where students are actively engaged in their learning and connected to their school and community. Our High Five program promotes positive behavior in students. In 17-18 we shifted to a seven period day to allow students to take electives like computer coding in addition to their core classes. For 18-19, we want to meet our goals of continued improvement on state testing and improvement in school climate by offering targeted support classes in math and reading, implementing systematic positive incentives, and improving attendance.



EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES



PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Our school believes that having actively engaged parents promotes student learning. We encourage parents to attend our monthly parent meetings, serve on Site Council, and volunteer for school activities such as dances and field trips. We keep parents informed through the use of our school website, a text messaging system, emails, and flvers home. We also use Home Access to allow parents to keep track of student's grades, find out what assignments are missing, and essentially see the teacher's grade book before the final grade is given, allowing parents to track their student's progress.
