Craft Team:

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Snowflake Paper Plates



Supplies:

- ★ Paper plate(s)
- ★ Puffy Paint (various colors) or,
- ★ Yarn (various colors) & Glue (like Elmers)
- ★ Newspaper, cardboard, etc. to use as a surface protector

Puffy Paint Instructions:

1. Layout your newspaper, cardboard, etc. to cover your work surface.
2. Place plate upside down on the covered work surface.
3. Using the puffy paint, squeeze gently and create a snowflake pattern. Remember, every snowflake is unique!
4. Let dry completely before displaying

Yarn & Glue Instructions:

1. Layout your newspaper, cardboard, etc. to cover your work surface.
2. Place plate upside down on the covered work surface.
3. Using the glue, squeeze gently and create a snowflake pattern. It is best to do one line at a time!
4. Take your yarn and gently lay it along your glue line. Trim your yarn pieces as you go.
5. Let dry completely before displaying

Optional:

Carefully punch hole in the top of plate and thread string or yarn to make a loop hook to hang your decoration from.

Christmas Tree Card Art Project

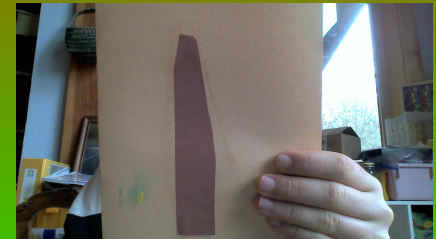
Materials . . .

- Different colored construction paper (such as green, red, brown, white and blue)
- Scissors
- Glue (a glue stick would work best for this)
- Sequins or other small decorative things (Puff balls, small pieces of paper, ect.)
- markers/gel pens
- Lots of creativity



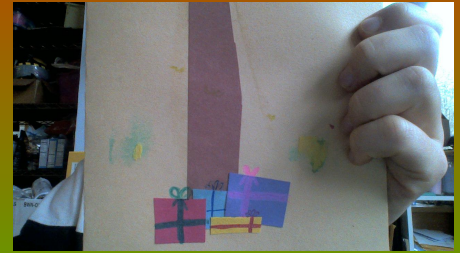
Instructions . . .

- Fold one of the white pieces of paper in half, for the base of the card. (ex. 1)
- Cut a trunk for a christmas tree out of the brown piece of paper. (ex.2)
- Now glue the trunk to the front of the card. (ex.3)
- Cut strips of the green paper, starting long and getting shorter.
- Fold the ends of all the cut green pieces of paper only a little bit.
- Cut tiny little circles out of the paper (if you don't have sequins) (ex.4)



Instructions Cont. . . .

- Start glueing the paper circles on the green paper in desired order, not on the smaller folded part. (ex. 1)
- Cut squares of different colors (for the presents)
- Glue the squares to the bottom of the trunk, then if desired, use a marker of your choice to draw a ribbon on them (ex. 2)
- After you decorate them with paper circles, glue the green pieces of paper to the trunk, only putting glue on the parts that are folded and spacing the edges to where it pops out (ex. 3)



Instructions cont. . . .

- After you put all the green pieces of paper on, you can cut out a star out of yellow paper - but don't glue it yet!! (ex. 1)
- Cut a green piece of paper to glue at the very top of the christmas tree - make it into a circle (ex. 2)
- Before gluing the green piece on, glue the star onto the green piece, then glue the whole thing on making sure that the star is facing out (exs. 3-4)
- After that you can add your own details to it, make it your own, make it different, make it unique!

DIY Holiday Ornament

Things you need for this craft.

- Plastic Ornament
- Some paint (I prefer red or green)
- Some glitter (Red or green)
- Paper plate or plastic bag or paint palette
- A Permanent Marker
- A Paintbrush (optional)
- Newspaper, cardboard, or other material to cover your work space



The Step By Step Instructions

1. Gather supplies and cover your work area with newspaper, cardboard, etc.
2. Pour the paint on a little plate (bowl, paint palette, or even into a plastic bag)
3. Pour some of the same color glitter into the paint and mix
4. Remove the top cap on the ornament carefully (the little metal piece where the hook or string goes)
5. Using your paintbrush, paint the inside of the ornament. *
 - a. * You may also pour in the paint and glitter mixture from your bowl or plastic bag
6. Make sure you coat the inside well **
 - a. ** A neat trick is to replace the top cap on the ornament and holding it securely with your finger, shake the ornament. DO THIS OUTSIDE AWAY FROM ANYTHING!



The Step By Step Instructions

7. When you're done painting or shaking your Ornament, put the lid on it and place it on a covered surface to dry.
8. When dry, use a permanent marker and write your name or other message on it.

Helpful Hints:

- You may also write other messages on your ornament, some ideas include:
 - The year (Example: 2020)
 - Another person's name if it is a gift (Example: Mom, Dad, Grandma, etc.)
 - A nice message (Example: Happy Holidays!)
- Wait for the permanent marker to dry before you touch it.

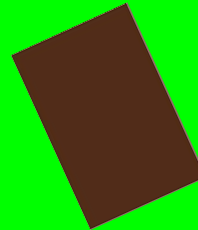
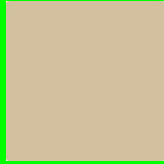
Reindeer Craft

Materials

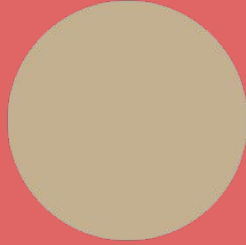
1. Light Brown paper
2. Scissors
3. Glue
4. Marker
5. Fluff ball
6. Dark brown paper
7. Googly eyes



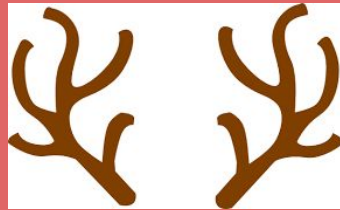
Note: If you do not have fluff balls or googly eyes use markers.

Step By Step Process

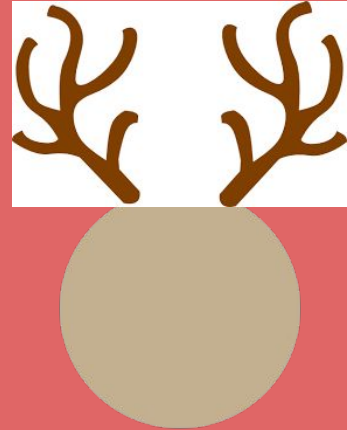
1. Use scissors to cut light brown paper into a circle. (You can use a cup or bowl to trace a circle!)



2. Use scissors to cut dark brown paper into antlers.



3. Use glue to glue the antlers to the head



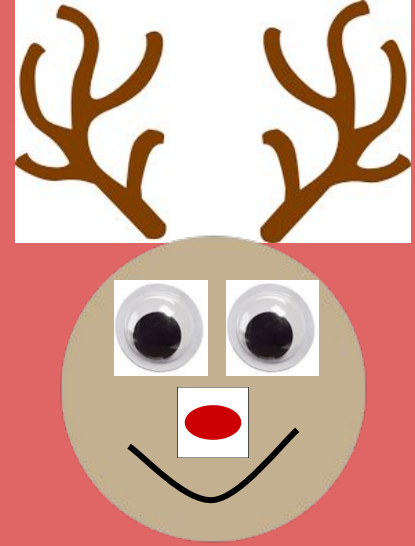
Step By Step Process

4. Use googly eyes or marker and draw or glue on eyes.

5. Use fluff ball or red marker and draw or glue on a nose.

6. Use marker to draw the mouth.

You can add any details of your choice!

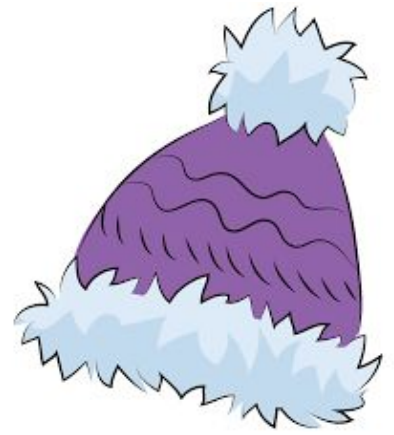

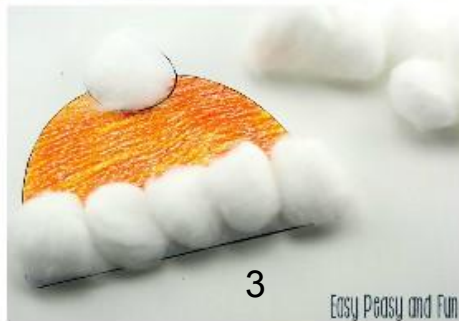
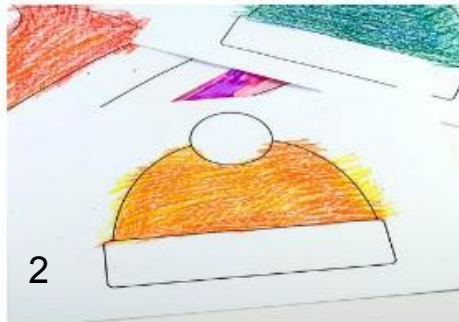
What you will need:

- hat template (included in last slide)
- colors – crayons, watercolors, markers, dot markers, stickers, coloring pencils (whatever is available and on hand)
- cotton balls
- white school glue
- Scissors
- String or yarn for hanging (Optional)

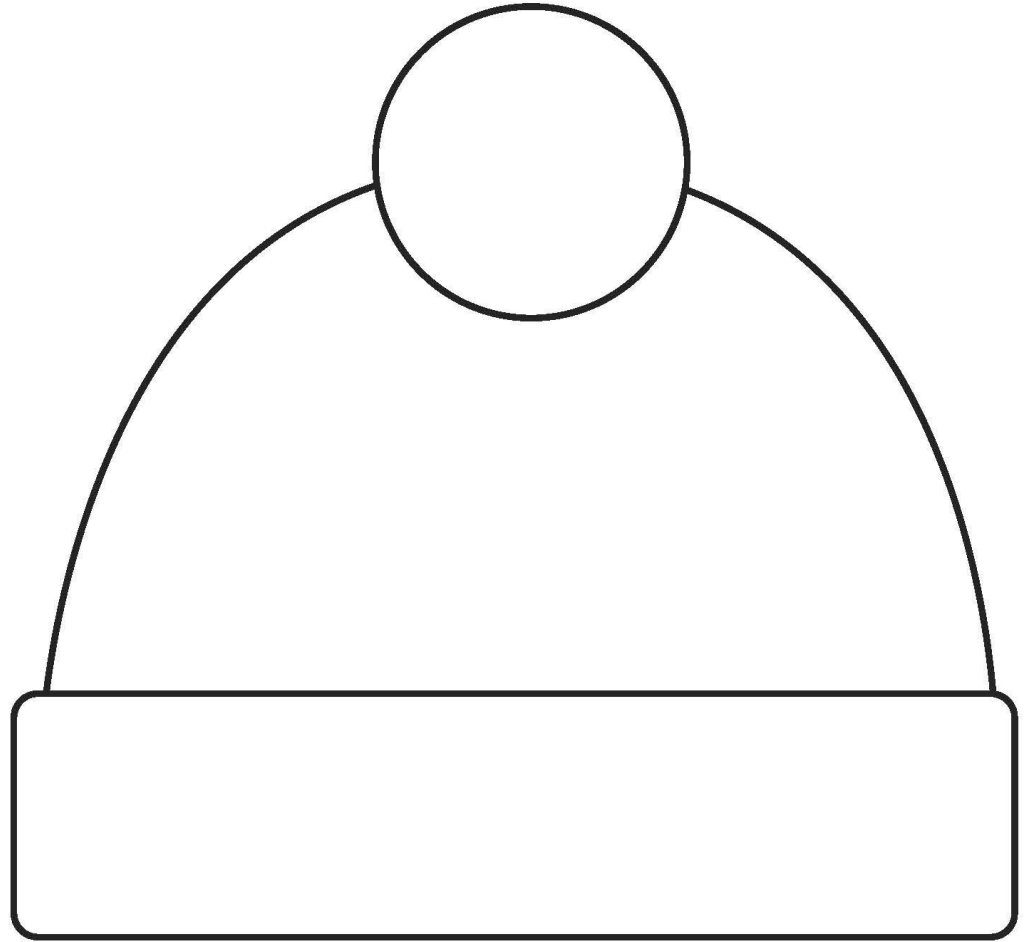
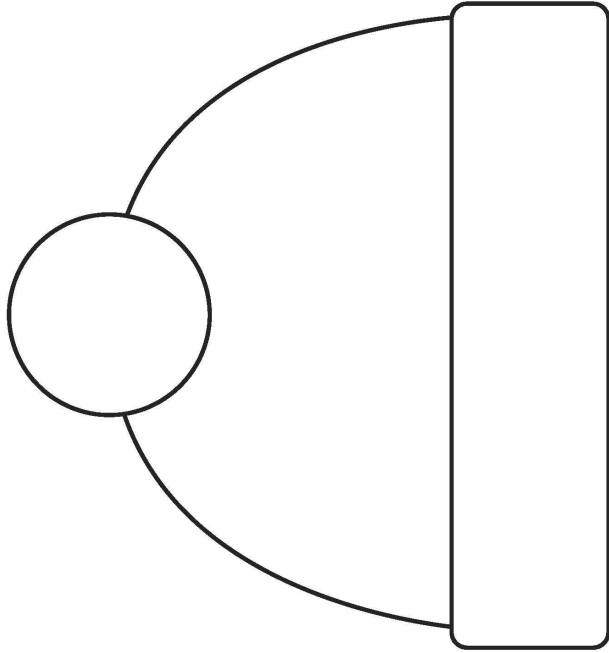


Instructions

1. Print as many copies of the hat template as you need (Next slide)
2. Color the hats. By coloring before you cut the hats, you may color outside the lines to ensure full coverage!
3. Cut out the hats
4. Add glue on top and bottom of the hat and stick cotton balls to it for the trim
5. If desired, glue string or yarn to the back of the hats at the top to make "chain" decoration or glue loops to the hats to make individual ornaments.



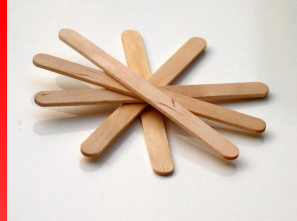

BUILDING... RUDOLPH!

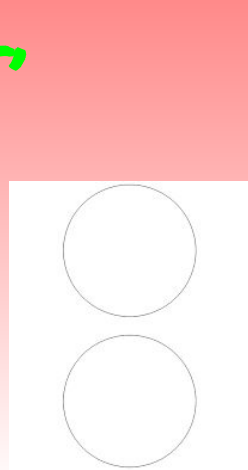
YOU KNOW RUDOLPH THE RED NOSED REINDEER,
RIGHT WELL, LET'S BUILD HIM!!!!

MATERIALS...

FIRST, GATHER YOUR MATERIALS: A PAPER PLATE, 4-6
POPSICLE STICKS, A RED PUFF BALL, GLUE, A BROWN
MARKER OR COLORED PENCIL,
AND 2 CIRCLE PIECES OF
BLANK PAPER.



HOW-TO BUILD HIM . . .

FIRST, YOU GET THE PAPER PLATE AND THE COLORED PENCIL OR BROWN MARKER AND COLOR THE ENTIRE PLATE BROWN.



AFTER THAT YOU GLUE THE RED PUFF BALL TO THE CENTER OF THE PLATE.



NEXT, TAKE THE POPSICLE STICKS AND SNAP 2 TO 4 OF THEM IN HALF



HOW-TO BUILD HIM . . .

NEXT, TAKE THE POPSICLE STICKS AND SNAP 2 TO 4 OF THEM IN HALF TO MAKE THE ANTLERS

THEN YOU GLUE THEM TO THE TOP OF THE REINDEER

AFTER YOU PUT ON THE ANTLERS, DRAW CIRCLES ON THE WHITE PIECE OF PAPER. USE A CUP OR GLASS TO TRACE.

THEN, CUT THE WHITE DOTS OUT AND COLOR THEM WHATEVER COLOR YOU'D LIKE.

GLUE ON THE EYES AND THEN DRAW THE MOUTH

FWALA!

YOU NOW HAVE RUDOLPH!!!
