


### What does Hybrid mean?



- 1. Hybrid means students will attend school two days a week and work from home two days a week.
- 2. Students in the "A" block will attend Tuesdays and Thursdays. Students in the "B" block will attend Wednesdays and Fridays.
- 3. On their "At Home" days students will use Google Classroom to check in and access their classwork for that day.

# Why Hybrid?

- ODE guidance requires us to have 35 square feet per student in each classroom. So, our class sizes will average around 15. We also have to limit the number of students who can eat lunch together.
- 2. We don't have the physical space to have all students in the building and keep to the 35 square feet guideline and social distance.
- Staggering the schedule so that only half the students are in school at once allows us to follow state guidelines and social distance.





### Cohorting

Students will be assigned to a classroom cohort. They will stay in that classroom with that group all day with the exception of lunch, P.E., and any SPED support.

Teachers will rotate between classrooms.

Our goal is to limit the total number of students that a student interacts with each day in order to minimize potential exposure and keep students and staff as safe as possible.



#### Masks!

Face Masks must be worn at all times, inside or outdoors. The exception is eating lunch.

Face masks must be worn correctly- covering the nose, mouth, and chin.

Face masks cannot promote drugs, alcohol, violence, or hate.



## **Social Distancing**

All students and staff will be required to social distance at all times and keep six feet between them to the maximum extent possible.

This includes whether they are at lunch, in P.E., outside, or on the bus.



### **Health Reminders**





- Please don't send students to school if they are sick!!!!
- 2. Students will be screened as they enter the building.
- 3. Students who arrive at school ill or become ill at school will be removed from their peers and parents contacted to pick them up.
- 4. Please make sure your contact information and your emergency contacts are current.
- 5. We all need to work together to open safely and stay open.

#### Keep your child home if......

- They have a temperature of greater than 100.4 F in the past 24 hours
- They have a new or worsening cough
- If they are experiencing shortness of breath or difficulty breathing



- If anyone in their home has been diagnosed with COVID-19
- If anyone in their home currently has symptoms of COVID-19
- They experience any of the following:
  - Nausea/vomiting
  - o Diarrhea
  - Fatigue
  - Muscle/Body Aches
  - Headache
  - New loss of taste or smell
  - Sore Throat
  - Congestion or runny nose




## On Their "At Home" Days

Students will have "applied learning" which is work or assignments they need to complete during their "At Home Learning" time.

Students will be able to access their work in Google Classroom and turn it in to Google Classroom. Students do not have to follow a specific schedule on their "At Home Learning" days.

Students will also have to complete an "attendance" question for each class. Students will be shown how to do this and how to access their work in Google Classroom.

We are required to take attendance on these "At Home" Days. Students who do not answer the attendance question for each of their classes will be considered absent on that "At Home Learning" day.



### **Other Changes**



- 1. No lockers. Students can take their backpacks into their classrooms.
- 2. Parents/Visitors are only allowed in the office. Only staff and students in the main building.
- 3. No Bus Passes
- 4. Students cannot share classroom supplies.
- 5. Students must have their names on their belongings.
- 6. Drinking fountains will be turned on but not the bottle filler. Students who want to bring a water bottle should make sure to fill it each morning from home.

### **More Changes**

Students will not eat breakfast at school.

They will be given the option of taking home two breakfasts- one for the "At Home" day and one to eat before they come to school their next "in person day".

School breakfast and lunch will continue to be free.

Students will not have access to a microwave at lunch.

No snack bar.



## More and More Changes



- 1. We will not be opening any part of the building to students until 8:00 AM. Buses will not arrive before 8:00 AM. We encourage parents who transport to drop off students between 8:15 and 8:20.
- 2. Unlike in past years, we will not open the front entry room for students to wait in. Students will have to wait outside, no matter what the weather is like.
- 3. Students waiting outside for school to open must socially distance and wear masks.

#### For all students-

We will review new protocols and changes with students during their last day of Distance Learning

#### For sixth graders-

Their first day back on the 25th or 26th will be a day of orientation

#### For all students-

We will continue to review expectations and educate students on these new protocols to help them successfully transition back to onsite learning under the Hybrid Model.
